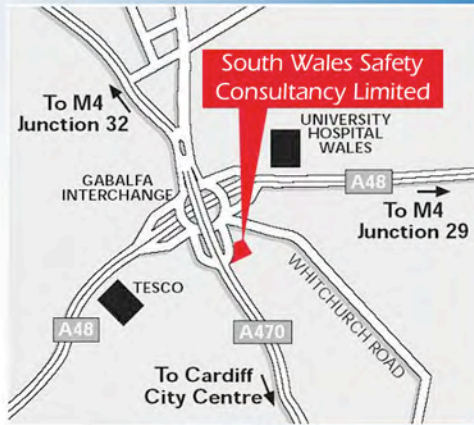


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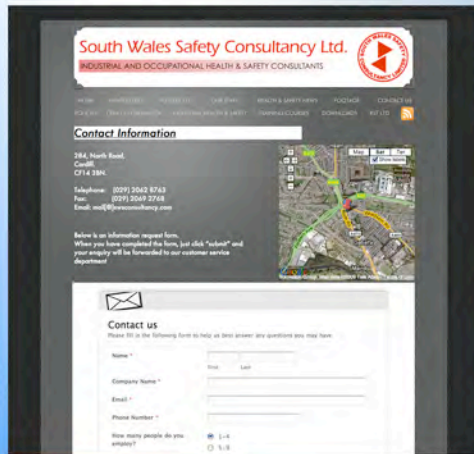
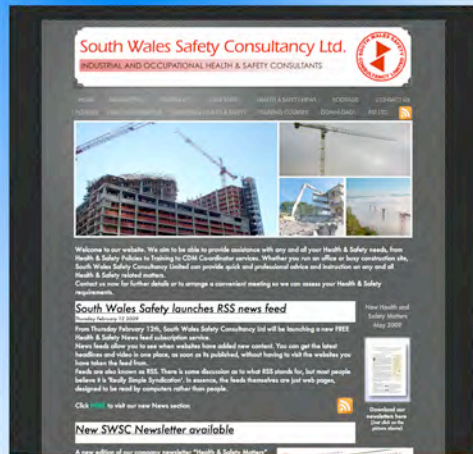

According to Health and Safety Executive figures, in the year 2006/2007, 241 workers were fatally injured.
